Financial ABC'S
Advice by WB Roman Vaynshtok

With the market dive in 2008, unexpected behavior on May 6, 2010, and the Social Security Administration statement saying that in 2010 they are distributing more funds than they collect, it's a good time to talk about retirement. Your 401K balance on the eve of your retirement obviously depends on how much you saved over your working life and on the performance of your investments. But there are other factors that influence the size of your nest egg, including how early you start saving and when you leave the work force. Here are four factors that determine the final balance of your 401K.

1. When you begin saving

Workers who start saving for retirement in their 20s and follow through, often have the most impressive 401K balances. For example, a worker who saves \$5,000 each year between ages 25 and 65 and earns 5% interest would have \$634,199 in retirement. An employee who saved the same amount annually but didn't start until age 35 would have just \$348,804.

2. Saving continuously

Make it like a payment, almost like your utility bill or your car payment. If you switch into a new job without a 401K plan, roll your old 401K over and set up your own retirement account like IRAs.

3. Employer contributions

An employer 401K match that is vested is an instant return on your investment. If you are not able to maximize your 401K contributions at least make an amount that is allowed to get employer matches in full.

4. Asset allocation

Retirement savers need to balance safety with the need to build wealth. As your retirement account gets larger, rebalancing can have a huge effect as you approach retirement.
